General Consideration of a Minerals Contract

Contract Considerations	Illustrative Approaches
Principles	Emphasize or de-emphasize State equity
Objectives	Seek to attract or not attract foreign investment
Obligations & Responsibilities	Onus on Government and/or on Company
Transparency	Complete, partial, guided disclosure
Specific Requirements	Technical, fiscal, environment, social, reporting, disposition of assets
Direct/Indirect Mining Terms	Local procurement, infrastructure, community development, resource corridor

3. Application of Law, Change of Law, Disputes	Duration
 Official Language, Interpretation Definitions – "more is more"! 	Law
6. Enforcement	Language
 a. Institutional responsibilities/authority b. Financial penalties 	Definitions
c. Civil/criminal actions	Enforcemt





"Licensing" Contract Terms Licensing 1. Exploration, Exploitation – triggers to Type(s) commence operation Area 2. Size of Area, boundaries, rights of way 3. Conditions of the licenses, i.e., Conditions a. Feasibility reports, Duration b. Expenditure/production requirements c. Insurance, inspection Transfer 4. Duration, renewal, relinquishment, partial Terminate 5. Transfer of license rights 6. Termination – expiration, suspension, revocation





"Obligations" Contract Terms **Obligations** 1. Financial a. Performance guarantees/escrow accts Financial b. Stabilization, surface rent (equity?) **Fnvironment** 2. Environment a. Env Impact Assessment, Management Plans Social b. Permitting, testing, inspection Reporting 3. Social a. Community Development Agreement Disclosure b. Impacts assessed, compensation, resettlement 4. Reporting (*exploration, production, H&S*) Insurance 5. Disclosure (full, partial, specified)

6. Insurance (operations, workers, liabilities)
